#### **JUST THE FACTS:**

- ★ Close to 100 student veterans are enrolled in classes at UAS this fall semester.
- ★ UAS received \$452,750 tuition/fee payments from the Veterans Administration (VA) over the last academic year.



### **Mature Leadership**

Student veterans have made major sacrifices to serve their country, and can be assets to the campus community. They are mature and focused and often have leadership experience.

## **Grades and Their Impact:**

Withdraws (both student and faculty) and NB grades = **substantial** debt to the student veteran.

It's better financially for our student veterans to receive a failing grade instead of a withdraw or NB. The VA will pay for classes where the student receives an F but will request funds returned with withdraws or NBs.

## **Class Choice and the VA:**

Classes the VA will **NOT** pay for:

- 1. Classes that do not apply to the student's degree program;
- 2. Online remedial courses (**only on-campus** remedial courses can be funded by the VA).

#### **Substitutions:**

If any substitutions are made, written documentation of that substitution must be submitted to the School Certifying Official (SCO), Deborah Rydman.

# When Students Have to Deploy:

UAS must accommodate Servicemembers and Reservists who may be absent due to service requirements. (*Principles of Excellence #4*)

Federal regulations require institutions to comply with readmission requirements for student veterans whose enrollment was impacted by a military service obligation.

#### Faculty are encouraged to:

- 1. Maintain connections with students who are deployed;
- 2. Establish procedures to simplify re-enrollment/course completion for service members returning to campus following deployment.
