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"They are my inner strength" Creating an Indigenous Knowledge Center

In March 2017 Egan Library Director Elise Tomlinson and library faculty Jonas Lamb collaborated with Lance Twitchell, Alaska Native Languages and Studies faculty, to author a proposal for a Department of Education "Strengthening Institutions Program" grant. The project would, (1) Create an Indigenous Knowledge Center within Egan Library that is a safe indigenous space to centralize and promote the quality and value of Alaska Native/Indigenous knowledge, facilitate healing, and increase the self-esteem and academic success of American Indian & Alaska Native students. (2) Develop an Elders and Indigenous Scholars in Residence program. (3) Enhance access and delivery of hybrid courses in AK Native Languages to preserve the continuity of endangered indigenous languages. The Department of Education will announce funded projects soon.
